- The Minority Fellowship Program's (MFP) mission is to educate ethnic minority nurses with expertise in mental health and/or substance use disorders that are prepared to assume leadership positions in education, research, practice, and health policy.
- The previously titled Now is the Time: Minority Fellowship Program-Youth (MFP-Y), now the Masters Minority Fellowship Program, has as the mission to prepare psychiatric nurses with the expertise to provide mental health and/or substance use disorder services to underserved minority youth, adolescents, and transitional-aged youth.



SIGNIFICANCE

- The MFP program develops ethnic minority nurses who are recognized for excellence in creating, transmitting, and using knowledge and skills to improve the health of people in local and global communities.
- The program also increases the number of Doctoral and Masters prepared nurses from underrepresented ethnic minority groups.

Congratulations! The National Advisory Committee of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA) Minority Fellowship Program (MFP) at the American Nurses Association (ANA) has reviewed your academic progress portfolio for FY2020-2021 and reappointed you for the 2021-2022 academic year, effective October 1, 2021. By accepting this Fellowship, you are agreeing to **full-time enrollment** in an accredited psychiatric mental health nursing program with a focus on mental health and/or substance use disorders, prevention, or treatment. The knowledge acquired will prepare you to address SAMHSA's purpose and goals of eliminating behavioral health disparities among racial/ethnic minority populations as experts who can expand culturally and linguistically appropriate, evidenced based services to underserved ethnic minority populations with mental health and substance use issues. Moreover, you are committing to join the nursing workforce in mental health and/or substance use for a minimum of 2-years upon graduating with your degree.

Fellowships are renewed annually, and appointments can range from 1 to 5 years. Importantly, renewal of your Fellowship is contingent upon your compliance with all SAMHSA MFP/ANA requirements, successful academic performance, and the continued availability of funding from SAMHSA, the granting agency. Specifically, submit a copy of the courses you are enrolled in at the beginning of each semester or term. Over the course of the year, the MFP/ANA will sponsor a series of mandatory educational offerings to include webinar trainings, and a 3-day Intensive Training Institute (ITI). Speakers/lecturers for these activities will be leaders in their specific areas who are dedicated to guiding and supporting MFP/ANA Fellows in becoming expert clinicians, educators, researchers, and health policy experts. Your participation in these learning activities are required components of your Fellowship. Additional offerings include a 12-week eStatistics online course, twitter chats and other activities that are designed to strengthen your knowledge and skills. SAMHSA will also sponsor webinar trainings, surveys, and other programmatic resources that will be shared through the SAMHSA MFP Coordinating Center (MFPCC).

As a Fellow, you are encouraged to participate in and contribute to the ethnic minority organization(s) of your choice. These organizations provide additional support and can be excellent forums for presenting and refining your research and practice ideas. Please note all your presentations, publications, dissertations and scholarly quality improvement projects must include the required SAMHSA disclaimer, "Funding for this (research, scholarly, or quality improvement project) was made possible (in part) by Grant Number 5H79SM080386-04 from SAMHSA. The views expressed in written training materials or publications and by speakers and moderators do not necessarily reflect the official policies of the Department and Human Services; nor does mention of trade names, commercial practices, or organizations imply endorsement by the U.S. Government."

Documents you will be required to submit to the Office of the MFP 30 days after the end of each semester (or term) include an (1) official copy of your transcript; (2) an assessment of your academic progress signed by you and your major faculty advisor that describes your clinical and/or research competencies,

clinical service related to activities in psychiatric mental health and/or substance use depicted in hours, population group(s) served, and settings; (3) Mentor progress summary and number of mentor/mentee meetings. Also, you will be asked to describe any MFP or other trainings, or surveys completed, oral or podium presentations, published manuscripts, board or committee service, awards/honors and other scholarly, leadership, or community activities.

As you plan your yearly budget, please be aware that the SAMHSA MFP FY 2021-2022 maximum allowable annual stipend award is \$22,000. The stipend is solely funded by SAMHSA and is paid directly to you in three installment payments. The first stipend disbursement of \$10,000 will be paid by direct deposit into your financial institution shortly after October 1; the second installment of \$6,000 will be disbursed in December 2021; and the final \$6,000 FY 2021-2022 will be disbursed in April 2022.

It is imperative that you comply with all MFP requirements and adhere to all established timelines. Non-compliance will result in delays in receiving your stipend payments, re-payment of stipend payments or termination of your Fellowship.

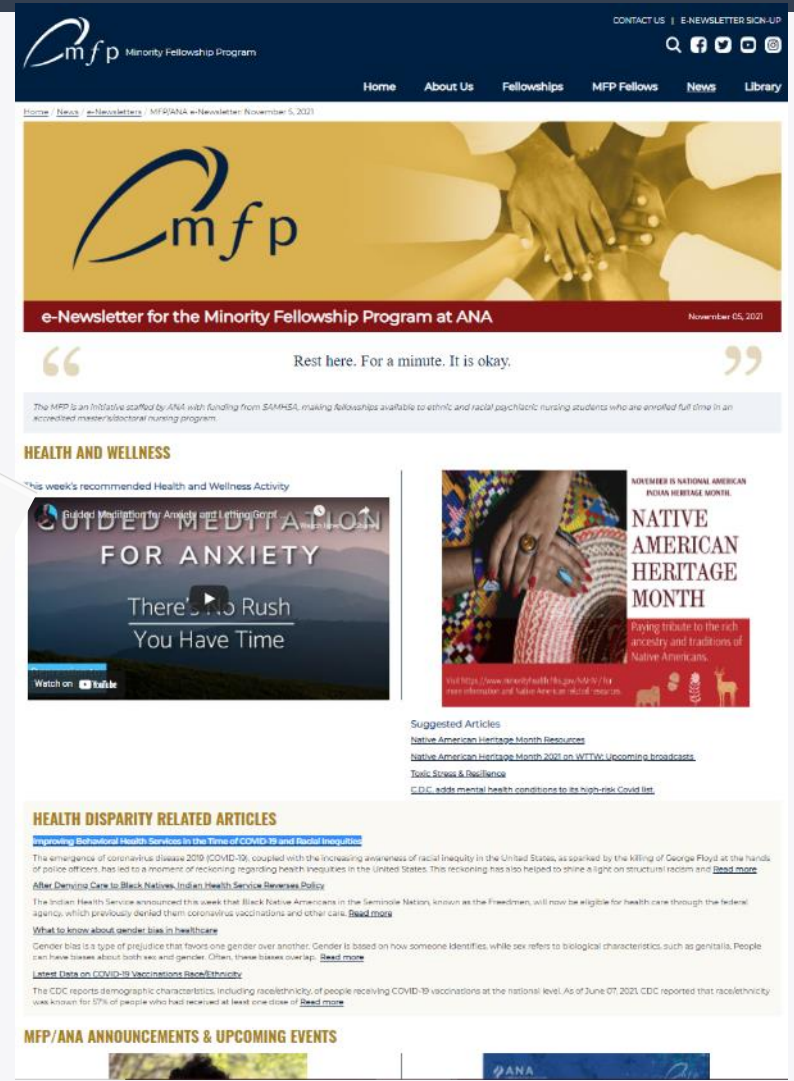

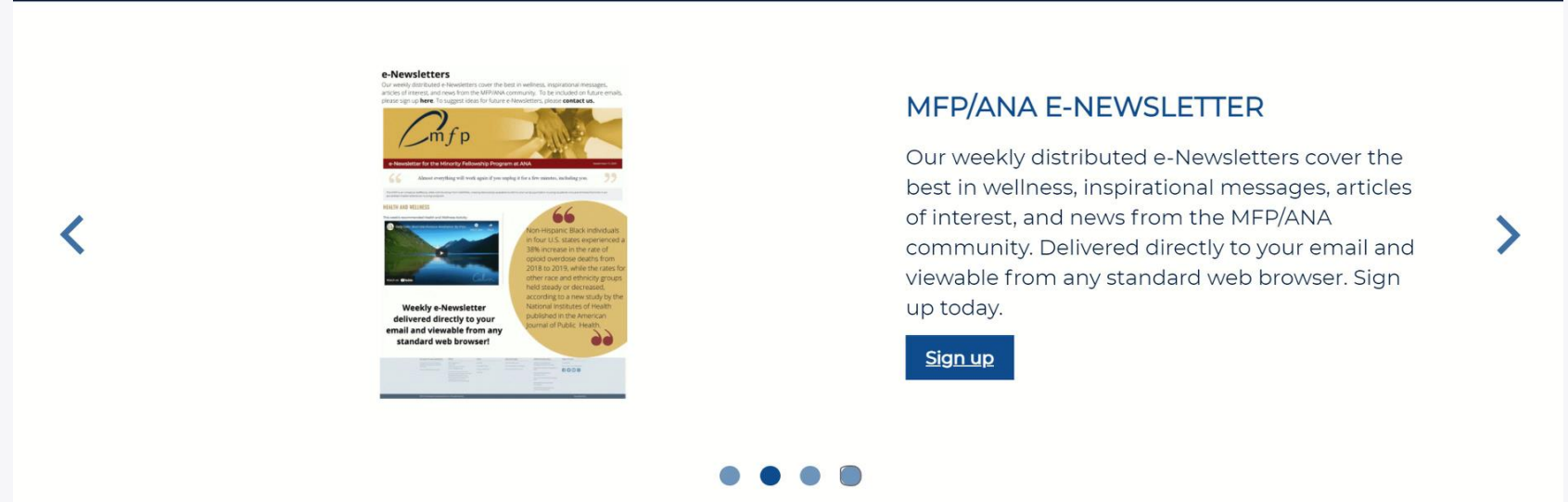
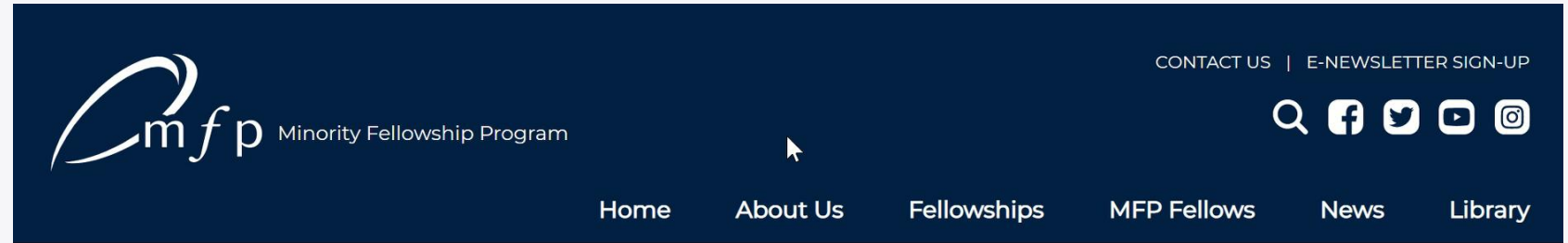
